### CHECKLIST FOR EASY ENROLLING

- High School Transcripts
- Picture I.D. (a driver's license)
- Birth Certificate
- Immunization Records (up-to-date, including Chickenpox and Hepatitis B)
  - Call your County Health Department for free\* immunizations. If you are under 18, you will need to take a parent/guardian with you.
  - Oakland County 248/858-1305
  - Detroit City 313/876-4333
  - \* Macomb County 586/573-2090, Warren
  - \* Minimal fees charged for immunizations here.
- Child Care Information: To register for child care, bring each child's immunization records and health forms.

### CHILD CARE FOR TEEN PARENTS

Child Care for your children while you're in class.

- Daytime students: Child Care is provided for children ages 6 weeks to 5 years
- Educational preschool
- Certified preschool/child care staff

### LOCATIONS: EASY ACCESS

Classes are offered at three sites: Taft Education Center just north of Eight Mile Road in Ferndale, Jefferson Center in Oak Park, and Crossroads Campus on Northland Drive in Southfield. SMART/DOT bus lines run near each location, and all have free parking.
